Orange County Data Dashboard

- Orange County Cases to Date: **246,820**

 - Santa Ana Deaths to Date: **702**
- Orange County Test Positivity Rate: **3.9%**
 - Orange County Health Equity Quartile Positivity Rate: **5%**

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What is Health Equity?

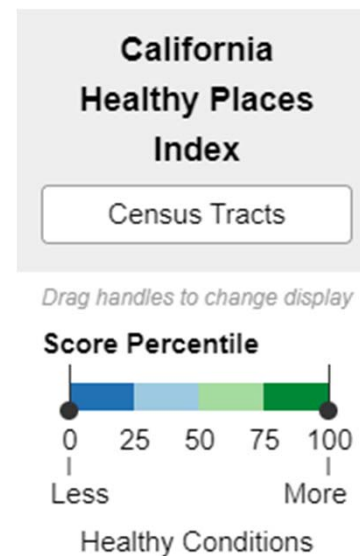
- **“Health equity is the attainment of the highest level of health for all people. Achieving health equity requires valuing everyone equally with focused and ongoing societal efforts to address avoidable inequalities, historical and contemporary injustices, and the elimination of health and health care disparities.”**
 - Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)



What is the Health Equity Metric?

- Based on the California Healthy Places Index
- Measures 25 indicators in the following categories:
 - Economic
 - Social
 - Education
 - Transportation
 - Housing
 - Environment
 - Neighborhood





Blueprint for a Safer Economy

County Risk Level	Daily New Cases (per 100k)	Positive Tests	Health Equity Quartile
Widespread - Tier 1 (Purple)	>7 new daily cases	>8%	
Substantial - Tier 2 (Red)	4 - 7 new daily cases	5 - 8%	5.3 - 8%
Moderate - Tier 3 (Orange)	1 - 3.9 new daily cases	2 - 4.9%	2.2 - 5.2%
Minimal - Tier 4 (Yellow)	<1 new daily cases	<2%	<2.2%



City Efforts to Address Health Equity?

- **City Funded multiple testing locations**
- **Multi-lingual staffing for SAC vaccination site**
- **Rental assistance**
- **Small business assistance**
- **Data modeling**
- **Vaccine hesitancy outreach with UCI**
- **Outreach and assistance for residents having trouble with Othena**
- **Partnerships with the Health Care Agency, Latino Health Access, Memorial Care, Albertsons, and others to distribute vaccines**

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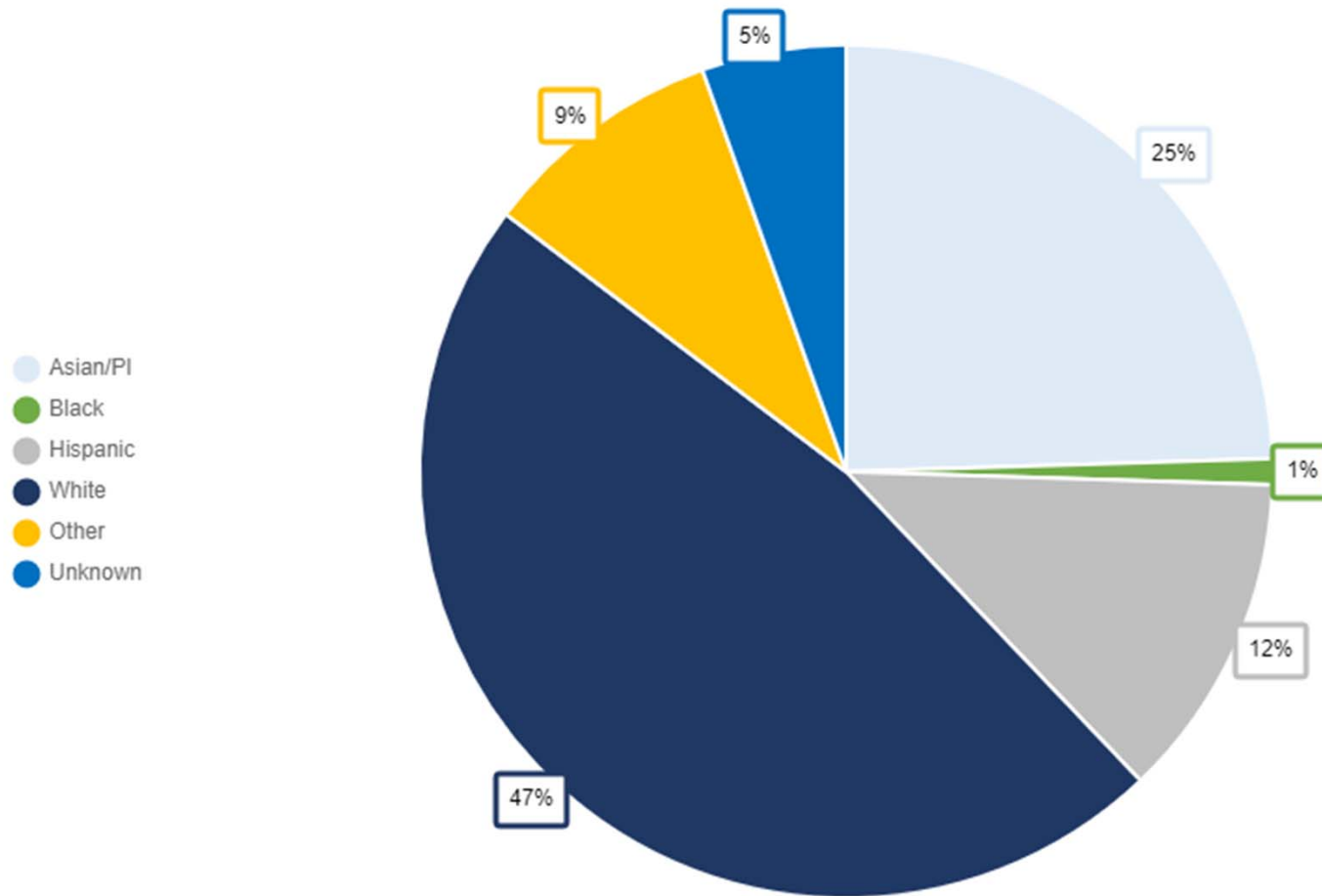
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Vaccine Doses Administered in OC

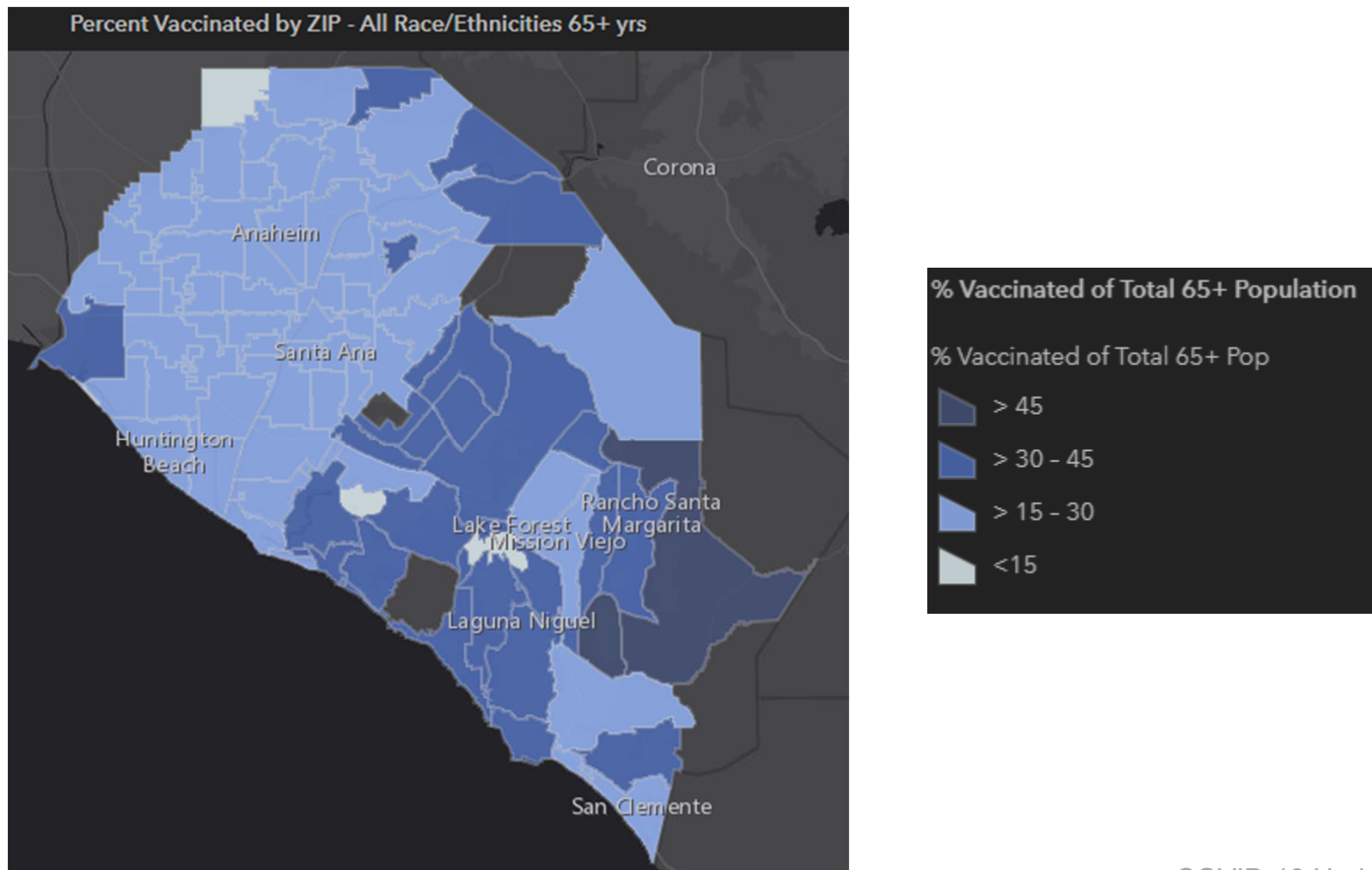
Doses	Number of Persons	Percent

COVID-19 Vaccination Distribution

- Currently in the State eligible recipients of the vaccination include all Phase 1A individuals (65+, healthcare workers) and Phase 1B individuals (educators, food service workers, etc).



How to Get Vaccinated

- Eligible Individuals:
 - Individuals who live or work in Orange County can register online through **www.othena.com** to view available appointments.
- Not Yet Eligible Individuals:
 - Sign up at **myturn.ca.gov** to register to be notified when you're eligible or when appointments open up.



Vaccination Sites in Santa Ana

- **County of Orange Point of Distribution (POD) at Santa Ana College**
 - 1530 W 17th Street, Santa Ana, CA 92706
 - Vaccines are available by appointment only.
 - For eligible individuals, register online at **www.othena.com**.
- COVID-19 vaccination clinics for Santa Ana residents aged 65 or older are available by appointment at local school campuses.
 - Call Latino Health Access at (714) 805-7838.

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Santa Ana SAVES Program

- Santa Ana residents impacted by COVID-19 who are behind on rent and facing eviction can apply for up to 12 month's rent and receive free legal and mediation services.

Small Business Assistance



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Support for Businesses and Employers

- **Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL)**
 - Available for businesses, private nonprofits, homeowners, and renters
 - There is currently no expiration date for this benefit
- **Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loans**
 - Available to first and second time loan applicants
 - Provides loans to help fund payroll costs
 - Applications will be accepted until March 31, 2021
- **Small Business Incentive Program Grant**
 - The City of Santa Ana provides one-time \$5,000 grants to businesses with 5 or fewer employees.
 - Business owners must be within the US Department of Housing and Urban Development 80% income limits
